The development of Risk Assessment (RA) in organizations and enterprises, helps to prevent and avoid risks. The harmonious coexistence and functioning of these institutions in conjunction with the state services provided and inspections by the Labor Inspectors contribute to the achievement of Occupational Health and Safety objectives.

The breadth of the occupational risks of modern working environments requires a modern consideration of how to deal with them. Occupational risks extend across the entire workflow and can be grouped into:

- Inappropriate workplaces
- Electric Shock
- Contact with dangerous work equipment.
- Falls from a height or falls at the same level
- Contact with physical, chemical or biological agents
- Psychosocial factors
- Occupational diseases
